
Thandai

THANDAI INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups Half and Half (use regular milk)
- 2 cups Whole milk
- 1 tablespoon Rose water
- 1/4 cup Sugar + 2 tablespoon (adjust according to taste)
- 3/4 1 cup Water (adjust accordingly)

THANDAI MASALA INGREDIENTS

- 1 tablespoon Cashew pieces
- 1 tablespoon Melon Seeds (chaar magaz)
- 1/2 teaspoon Saffron strands
- 1/2-1 teaspoon Cinnamon Powder
- 1/2 teaspoon Nutmeg Powder
 1-2 teaspoon Rose petal spread
- (gulkand)
- 1 -1.5 teaspoon Saunf powder (Fennel seeds powder)
- 1 -1.5 teaspoon Cardamom Powder
- 1/2 teaspoon Poppy Seeds
- 10-12 pieces Almonds
- 10-15 pieces Pistachios
- 3-4 pieces Black Peppercorns



METHOD

Let's begin by soaking saffron strands in milk. Boil milk in a bowl and soak saffron strands in it. Allow it to sit for 15 - 20 minutes. Soaking saffron strands in hot milk releases its color and flavor. Stir it with a spoon and milk will have a beautiful pale yellow color. Set it aside.

Add all the nuts and spices (only the whole spices not the one in powder form) to a grinder. Grind spices to their powdered form. Set it aside. You can ground the spices in a motor and pestle too.

Boil milk in a heavy bottomed pan. When it comes to a full boil, stir in the nuts and spices one by one. Whisk so that no lumps remain. Add sugar and keep stirring the liquid. Give it a good boil and take it off the flame. Allow it to cool completely.

After 30 minutes stir in saffron flavored milk, rose spread and rose water. If no rose spread available add 2 tablespoon rose water. Allow it to sit for a while (an hour or more) so that it can soak in all the flavors. Later sieve it through a strainer, add water and refrigerate this drink for at least 3-4 hours or until chilled. Thandai taste best when served chilled.

Ingredients For Malpua Recipe For the Pancakes

- 1 Cup Plain Flour / All Purpose Flour (Maida)
- 2 Teaspoons Semolina (Sooji)
- 2 Teaspoons Powdered Sugar
- 3 Slices of White Bread
- 1/2 Teaspoon Green Cardamom Powder (Hari Elaichi Powder)
- 2 Tablespoons finely sliced Pistachios, for garnishing
- 2 Tablespoons finely sliced Almonds, for garnishing
- 3 Tablespoons Clarified Butter (Ghee), for frying

FOR THE SUGAR SYRUP

- 1.5 Cups Water
- 1/2 Cup Sugar
- 4 Crushed Green Cardamom (Hari Elaichi)
- 5-6 Saffron Strands (Kesar)

METHOD

Take Plain Flour (Maida) in a working bowl. Add Semolina (Sooji) and Powdered Sugar to the bowl. Mix all these dry ingredients well. Add water in desired quantity to make a batter of smooth consistency. Ensure that there are no lumps. Take 3 slices of white bread and crumble them in a food processor. Bread here is used as a substitute of yeast for fermentation. Add this crumbled bread to the batter, mix well and leave it aside for 15 minutes to allow fermentation.

In the meantime you can prepare the Sugar Syrup. Take a pan with broad base. Add 1/4 cup water to it and keep it on the flame. Add sugar to the water and heat it for 6-7 minutes to get a sugar syrup of flowing consistency. Take the syrup off the flame and add Saffron Strands (Kesar). Remove the skin from 4-5 pieces of Green Cardamom (Elaichi) and crush the inner seeds. Add the crushed Green Cardamom to the syrup. Allow the syrup to cool to room temperature.

Take a Pan (Kadai) and heat 3 spoons of Clarified Butter (Ghee) in it. When hot pour 1 big spoon of the pancake batter into it. This pouring should take place in center of the pan and should be from a little height and also bit spread out to about a 2 inch circle. Allow it to cook for 1-2 minutes and flip to the other side. Repeat flip till both sides become golden brown in color.

Dip the cooked pancakes in the sugar syrup. Malpua is ready. Take them out of sugar syrup and place on plate. Garnish them with finely chopped Almonds and Pistachios and serve hot.

Gujiya INGREDIENTS

FOR THE DOUGH

- 1 cup Maida
- 1 tablespoon Sooji (Semolina)
- 1/2 teaspoon Baking soda
- 1 tablespoon Unsalted butter or Ghee
- A pinch of Salt
- 1-2 tablespoon Milk

GUJIYA MIXTURE INGREDIENTS

- 1/4 cup Dessicated Coconut
- 1 cup Crumbled Khoya/Mawa
- 1/4 cup Superfine Sugar
- 2 tablespoon Milk
- 10-12 pieces of Raisins
 12 15 pieces of Almont
- 12-15 pieces of Almonds
 12-15 pieces of Pistachios
- 2 tablespoon of Cashew pieces
- 2 teaspoon Green Cardamom powder
- 1 teaspoon Saffron strands

SUGAR SYRUP - OPTIONAL

- 1/2 cup Sugar
- 4 tablespoon Water
- 1/4 -1/2 teaspoon Green Cardamom powder
- 1 teaspoon Rose water
- Few pieces of Saffron strands



METHOD

Assemble all the ingredients needed for gujiya dough. In a big bowl combine all the ingredients And knead a soft pliable dough .Cover the dough and let it sit for 30 minutes.

Meanwhile let's begin with our gujiya filling. Assemble all the ingredients. • In a heavy bottom pan add mawa, dry coconut and toast them on low heat. Toast for 15 minutes on a low flame when the mixture turns light brown in color, add saffron strand. Mix and take it off the flame.

In a separate kadhai add nuts (except raisins) and toast them on a medium flame. Once they start

omitting their aroma, take it off the flame and allow it to cool completely. Ground them in a grinder until it turns into a fine powder. Add this nutty mixture to the mawa mixture along with raisins.Stir it well. Add sugar, milk and mix until everything is well- blended

This mixture should be moist. To check - take some mixture in your hands, squeeze and if it forms a soft ball, its perfect and if its still crumbly add few more drops of milk to form a soft ball

Now to make Gujiyas ,Take a small golf size ball of the dough. Roll it in a thin circle. In the half fold, place some gujiya mixture. Fold gujiya into half. Apply water along the edges and seal it tight. Using a fork SECURE the edges by making imprints of the fork. Gujiya is ready for frying. All the gujiyas should be sealed properly or they will open up during frying, leaving a mess.

Heat oil in a pan. When ready for frying, lower the flame and fry gujiyas until golden brown in color. Gujiyas need to be fried in medium hot oil for a crispy layer. Remove from oil and drain it on the paper towel. Gujiyas are ready.

Let's prepare the sugar syrup. Combine all the ingredients in a pan and on a medium flame bring it too a boil. Scum will start forming on top of the liquid. Using a spoon, collect and discard. I had to remove it twice during the whole boiling process. Keep boiling till the liquid is reduced and it start to thicken. Lower the heat, dip spoon in the syrup and remove. Do not touch for the first few seconds, it will be very hot. Touch the syrup with your finger and if it coats your finger it means that it is about to reach it's first string consistency.

Dip each Gujiya in this syrup for 2-3 minutes and set it on a clean plate. sugar glazed Gujiyas are all set and ready to be eaten!!

THERE IS A CO-RELATION BETWEEN HEALTH OF PARRIKAR AND THE STATE

Www hen we were all set with our edition of magazine, there was a news that really was surprising and pleasing. Chief minister Manohar Parrikar who was admitted in Lilavati Hospital in Mumbai was discharged and returned to the State to present the Budget.

It was unbelievable considering the strong rumours that were spread about his health. Parrikar showed his will power, and we can say love towards the State.

Earlier, the news about the illness of chief minister Manohar Parrikar was sudden and shocking for the state which was waiting for him to table one of the most populist budget. During this tenure, Parrikar had embarked on a major challenge which is dangling between providing good governance and keeping his alliance partners happy.

The first news that we broke was about Parrikar being treated at Goa Medical College and Hospital. Our website was the first one to break the news before anyone. Though this is an achievement for any Journalist, considering the content of the news, it was too sad to be happy about.



Sources close to Parrikar maintained that he was ill and had stomach ache. And since he was going to Mumbai for his prior appointment, his family had decided to take second opinion in the hospital there.

It was told that he would be checked by a doctor in Mumbai's hospital and then he would proceed for his work.

Parrikar remained hospitalized from February 15 onwards and several news about his health are being flashed. The official version is that he is suffering from pancreatitis.

It is undisputed fact that Parrikar during his political career has won the hearts of the people. Many may call him as an arrogant person but his style of functioning was could not match any of his predecessor.

He was also the reason for sudden rise in the popularity of his party in the State. Parrikar's fan following spreads across all the section of people including Christian population who has been benefitted with the social welfare schemes that he designed during his tenure.

His popularity has nothing to do with his party. It is all his personal achievements.

When we speak about the crisis on the mining industry, there are two kind of arguments that are being made out.

He is the first person to openly point out the illegalities in the mining sector through his Public Accounts Committee report. I still remember interacting with him when he was extensively explaining how illegalities in the mining were flourishing. His report was the base for the Supreme Court's verdict which shut down the mining industry in the year 2012 till late 2014. In that sense, he can be considered as one of the reason behind mining crisis.

But at the same time, the wise and bold decisions taken by him as the chief minister to address the problems of the people affected with the mining closure helped them to tide over the financial crisis. The doles offered to them really helped this section of people living in the mining belt.

Parrikar has been considered as the master in economics. His well thought policies are worth emulating by the State governments to counter similar kind of situations to avoid people committing suicides.

It was a sheer coincident that his sickness

came during the time when mining industry was once again pulled into the crisis and they were looking at Parrikar to provide them the solution.

Couple of press conferences before he was taken ill were marked with the solutions for mining issue. He had clearly said that the government will work out solution for this issue.

There is no politician in the current lot who has the clear understanding about the mining industry, the way Parrikar has. The failure to provide solution for this issue will plunge several thousand families into crisis. The current agitation by the mining truck owners is indication of the frustration building up amongst those people dependent on this industry.

For BJP, which has not created any parallel leadership around Parrikar, these are difficult times. They have no credible face to replace Parrikar, if he remains out of the political bounds for next few months. They will have to manage with the second rung leadership which don't have kind of exposure that Parrikar has.

Those leaders who brushed shoulders with Parrikar during initial days of BJP in Goa have gone into oblivion. Laxmikant Parsekar, Rajendra Arlekar has faced defeat during 2017 elections. Sripad Naik has been elevated to the centre. The RSS leadership led by Subhash Velingkar which was with Parrikar has also divorced him.

In this situation, BJP will have to nurture the leadership which can take over till Parrikar returns back to the active politics with the proper health.


The parties like MGP and Goa Forward party has already announced that they will remain with the government till Parrikar is the chief minister. Considering a situation that BJP might replace Parrikar with another face giving him time to relax for some time, there is no certainty on the stability of the government.

GFP and MGP will have all the reasons in the world to withdraw support. If Parrikar remains out of political bounds for some time, then it is for sure that the stability could be compromised.

MANOHAR PARRIKAR SURPRISES ALL!!!!

His absence saw coalition government in fluid while BJP finds handicapped

anohar Parrikar- one who is known for his U-turns and unexpected political moves; took everyone by a surprise ON Thursday, when he landed in the State Assembly to table the Budget.

Since February 15, Parrikar was undergoing treatment at Lilavati hospital in Mumbai for pancreatitis ailment. Several speculations and rumours were simmering surrounding his medical health. However, he put everything to rest on Thursday.

Irrespective of all this; Parrikar, who is known for his dedication towards work, governance and State, was in constant touch with the officials in Goa- giving verbal directions/ instructions as far as the State Budget was concern.

State Budget 2018-19 which was drafted with much care by the Chief Minister was tabled by him.

Irrespective of all this, one cannot neglect the political situation in Goa that had turned fluid after Parrikar's sudden hospitalization.

The ruling BJP in the State too suffered from serious leadership crisis in absence of their beloved 'bhai' Parrikar, the tallest-leader of the saffron party for more than two and half decade now. The 63 year old Parrikar has worked from the front to grow this national party in the State since 2000, when it formed the government for the very first

In absence of Parrikar, senior most Minister from his coalition Ramakrishna 'Sudin' Dhavalikar was made leader of the House.

Beyond this session, senior BJP leader and minister for legislative affairs Francis D'Souza was supposed to head the party. Now with Parrikar back, how long still not clear, he will continue to head BJP

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Minister Nitin Gadkari. Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, were amongst the top BJP leaders who visited the ailing chief minister, one of their long-time lieutenants in the BJP. In fact, Prime Minister's Office and Gadkari are

personally monitoring the medical treatment of Parrikar.

TNV analysis the situation in Parrikar's absence.

IN the 40-member Goa assembly, the BJP leads a precarious alliance with MGP, Goa Forward, and two independents. The BJP won only 13 seats in the February 2017 election against the Congress party's 17. Soon after, the BJP number went up to 14 and the Congress tally reduced to 16 as Congress legislator Vishwajit Rane resigned and joined the BJP. Rane later got elected on a BJP ticket.

The Congress party has held the BJP-led alliance guilty of "stealing the mandate and betraying the people of Goa" and blamed Parrikar for heading "an unholy government". While the BJP-led coalition has formed a common minimum programme, there have been frequent bickering and differences of opinion among the three parties over a number of issues. It was only Parrikar, whose interventions,

helped resort all issues- making everyone seat together.

"Parrikar is the only glue that has kept this rickety government intact. While the speculations on Parrikar's health continue, the situation here has led to turmoil. Will have to wait and see how long everyone keeps the patience," a senior BJP leader, expressed it before TNV.

The Leader even pointed out, in absence of Parrikar, who if tomorrow prefers to quit from active politics on health ground, it would be difficult for BJP to cope up. "Only the sympathy wave can work," leader said.

The alliance partners were confident about Parrikar's return to take over the charge of the government soon. "He will be back soon and take over the charge. MGP has pledged their support to the BJP led alliance and we will not withdraw it till Parrikar is the chief minister," MGP President Deepak Dhavalikar told TNV.

He said that there is no question

of withdrawing the support even if Parrikar remains out of question for longer time. "Till he is the chief minister, we are there with the government," he said.

GFP president and Minister in Parrikar cabinet Vijay Sardessai too is hoping for his Chief Minister's come back. "Our lovalty with Parrikar remains. We are not going to backstab him in this condition. Parikar is a fighter and we all know that he will come back and hold the charge," he commented.


However, the bigger question that this raises is over the future of the BJP in the state without Parrikar in the lead. Minus Parrikar, there is no BJP in Goa. BJP has not taken enough trouble to mentor a second-rung leadership in the state. Although Parrikar managed to form a coalition government, a majority of its senior ministers including former chief minister Laxmikant Parsekar lost the election (in 2017 polls).

The BJP's two other senior faces include Union minister Shripad Naik and state chief and Rajya Sabha MP Vinay Tendulkar. Naik has been a CMin-waiting for long, but critics say he has no safe constituency. Also Naik is not very much loved in the party.

Another senior leader and incumbent Minister Francis D'Souza is also not medically and physically fit to take the charge of party full-fledged. Of late he too is going from serious medical problems.

"On or the other day, Parrikar had to retire from active politics. It is fact but the current situations are unexpected and also traumatizing for the party. Party members were never ready for such kind of situation," Tendulkar said refusing to speak anything further as he turns emotional.

Another BJP leader, on request of anonymity said, "Time has come when we need to project a new leader. Who it will be, we have no idea as at this point of time, we have no face in mind. But when Bhai comes back, we will hold discussion on this. Bhai himself would like to get his successor," the leader stated.

MMC starts crack down on commercial establishments without trade licences

ot too long ago the Margao Municipal Council had urged all the Margao businesses to get compliant with trade licences. The request fell on deaf ears. The MMC had gone ahead and formed a special purpose vehicle and a special counter for the registration of trade licences. However, even after the request, the same received very faint response. The MMC as their final measure has not cracked the whip on the commercial establishments in the Margao town. The shops operating without trade licenses were sealed by the MMC team.

At least 5 shops in Pajifond and Malbhat areas and 5 shops right in the heart of Margao town were sealed for not possessing or not displaying trade licences.

The Margao Municipal Council Chief Officer Johnson Fernandes had issued the orders to seal the shops operating without trade licences. Shops in Margao commercial areas like Malbhat and Pajifond were sealed until further notice by the team of MMC. Looking at the brewing trouble many shops around the areas of action remained shut.

The Accounts and Taxation officer of MMC Abhay Rane has informed that the action will continue and more shops, which fail to produce the trade licences, will be sealed if they don't acquire one and display it on time. The MMC has also said that the Shops who have trade licences are mandated to display them at the shop. This has been advised to make sure minimum trouble is given to the people who are compliant to the licences.

It may be recalled that the issue of trade licences has rocked several MMC meetings and there has been a pressing demand for survey of Margao and Fatorda Commercial areas for compliance. It was also known that several important commercial avenues have hundreds of businesses but never had acquired any trade licences for years.

Now, demands that the same action

be used for the shops in the Gandhi and new Market areas and penalise the one who are not compliant.

The MMC in the month of September 2017 had decided to have the dedicated counter for the issuance of Trade Licence and collection Signboard tax. The Chairperson had then contemplated the revenue collection to jump to crores after the exercise is complete.

The Chairperson of MMC told that the issuance and payments will be most hassle free and has urged all the traders who have complained that getting trade licence from MMC is a tough task. "The licence will be on the basis of one undertaking on Rs. 50 stamp paper and light or water connection proof," told Chairperson of MMC Babita.

The Chairperson has admitted that there are shortcomings in the Administration of the MMC and hence they have also contemplated an outsourcing of the collection of Trade and Other Taxes on revenue sharing model.

There are thousands of unassessed residential premises and 80% of commercial units without proper trade licences. A Building with 200 shops only has 30 to 40 trade licences issued which will result in honest men being charged and others free of fees.

"Since the Shadow Council for Margao and Loyal Taxpayer's of Margao have been consistently demanding that illegal trade establishments in Margao should be brought under the tax net, we sincerely congratulate the MMC for the drive by which 10 establishments were sealed. Our special congratulations to the Chief Officer Mr. Johnson Fernandes, for this bold initiative" said Savio Coutinho of Shadow Council.

"While hoping that the public will cooperate, we also expect the MMC to simplify the process of issuing trade licence so that the rush for trade licence which is likely to follow is cleared in minimum possible time," he said.

However, there have been some grays in this inquiry. Earlier last week

n the small beautiful village of Betul lies a very old fort at the mouth of the Sal River. It used to be a very important trading point during the Portuguese times and has a glorious past. However this fort now lies in total ruins with a very little of its traces left to call it a fort.Built on the orders of Shivaji Maharaj in 1679 Shivaji Maharaj had sent orders to the Hawaldar of Balli to build the Betul fort at a very strategic point which faces the mouth of Sal River so that they could control the Trade entering the River Sal.

The fort every year comes alive on the Independence Day and Shiv Jayanti on 19th Feb. Like every year this year to the fort was decorated and a bust of the great king Chatrapati Shivaji

Maharaj was installed at the fort. The fort sits in the small village of Quittol and is popularly called the Betul fort now. As we pass through the village of Betul winding through the narrow roads we reach the foothill of the fort. A short climb to the top one can see a big heavy canon placed at the tip of the fort. The History Lovers Group who has been fondly cleaning the area had in 2014 improved the condition of the fort. The cannon on the top had become virtually invisible to the people due to the thick bushes and dense vegetation all around the fort. An effort was made to clean up the fort on 16th November 2014.

It has been a decade, since we visited this place back in the winter of 2008. The reason why this trip was very special is because it was just supposed to be a drive to the place and back to Goa on the same day. But, we underestimated the distance and the destination. The village of Dandeli is approximately 140 Kms from Panaji, and it takes nearly four hours to reach the place. After reaching there we realised that, you cannot get the best of this place unless you spend an entire day or two.

The forest area of Dandeli was declared a Wildlife Sanctuary on 10th May 1956, but at that time covered only 204.33 sq.km. This was enlarged to 5725.07 sq.km on 10th May 1975. Realising that this was too big to manage with the industrial and mining pressures, it was reduced to 834.16 sq.km on 1st September 1988, and further to its present size of 475.02 sq.km. on 29th April 1994.

The Government of Karnataka has taken a good initiative called Jungle Lodges & Resorts which operates in other forest areas like Dandeli in the state. These resorts provide packages which includes, boat ride, white water rafting and an evening safari into the wildlife sanctuary. People are able to enjoy the beauty and serenity of the area without disturbing it.

We checked in to one such resort by name Kali Adventure Camp. The resort is located on the Kali River, and is at a distance of 10 Kms from the boundary



of the Dandeli Wildlife Sanctuary. The resort provides accommodation in airy tented cottages facing the river, and in deluxe rooms with modern amenities. Having keen interest in wildlife it gave me a sense of excitement of what you can experience. Well, after having lunch, the first activity on the list was the evening safari through the Dandeli Wildlife Sanctuary. Having visited the wildlife sanctuaries in Goa, I knew how difficult or a matter of luck it was to spot even a small wild animal in the forest. Maybe it's the challenge to spot a wild animal in its natural surrounding keeps the level of excitement high. Even though the excitement was high, the expectations were low, but I have to say that I underestimated Dandeli Wildlife Sanctuary. After driving deep in the forest we came across an open plain where we saw herds of spotted deer grazing. "Well, that was lucky", was the first thought that came to my mind, but the luck was not done with us yet. As our vehicle drove deep in the jungle, our driver stopped the car while out guide pointed his hand outside the vehicle and said, "There is the bison," and this was the first time when I actually saw a

huge wild animal in its natural surroundings. We requested our driver to wait there for some time to enjoy this majestic and huge creature moving around. After spending nearly four hours driving through this thick forest it was dark, and time to turn back

to our hotel and feast on some scrumptious dinner. The next day it was time for an early morning coracle (a small round boat) ride through the Kali River. The boat ride along the Kali River will help you encounter many colourful bird species such as hornbills, storks, flycatchers, falcons, bluethroatedbasrbets, bulbul etc. Even though this river is infested with crocodiles our guide assured us that they don't have a taste for humans.

Apart from its natural beauty, flora and fauna, Dandeli also has to offer something for the people having keen interest in local history, legends and folklore. A local legend states that the city is named after Dandelappa, a local deity, a servant of the Mirashi landlords, who lost his life because of his loyalty.TheDandelappa Temple is one of the important places to visit in Dandeli which attracts pilgrims and devotees all over the year. This is one of the oldest temples in the Dandeli town. An alternative legend states that a king named Dandakanayaka passed through the forests and named them after himself, and the city is believed to stand on the place where

Dandakaranya stood when he named the area.

Another important site is the Kavala Caves. Visited by pilgrims from all over the country especially on occasions like Shiv Ratri, Kavala Caves also welcome nature lovers and photography freaks to witness a phenomenal creation of the nature. River Kali slowly enters the caves from 40 feet down. Kavala caves is a surreal yet an important place on the list of Dandeli attractions.

Another most desired tourist destination for heritage lovers and trek enthusiasts, among the places to visit in Dandeli is the historic Shivaji Fort. It is believed to be once built by the great ChhatrapatiShivaji. The fort proudly boasts of the clever warring techniques and strategies implemented by the warriors to win an ongoing war and protect the fort from the enemies.

Pre-dating the Shivaji fort, Sri Mallikarjuna Temple stands as yet another oldest and most important Dandeli places. The temple witnesses pilgrims throughout the year. Majorly famous for the incomparable architecture of the temple. The temple of

UlviChannabasaveshwara is another important destination which is at a distance of 48 Kms from Dandeli.

Even though we had spent only two days in Dandeli, the unique feeling that this place has to offer will help you remember the time you spent at this place for years to come.

There is a sequence in the show where you replicated John in Dostana, please tell us something about it.



How much does the costume play a role in giving a makeover for the contestant and how much is his talent?


Your brand created waves in India Fashion Week in Dubai in the year 2015. Do you expect similar or more response this time for Rubaru Mr. India event?

Goa Budget was more of Parrikar, less of economics this time

hief Minister Manohar Parrikar was cynosure of all eyes as he got out of his official car at the State legislative assembly complex. Clad in a blue shirt and his signature style of dressing, he was smiling, confident, looked a bit of weak. Entire media, legislators, staff of assembly had left their seat and were waiting to see Parrikar arriving.

Accompanied by his elder son Utpal, the chief minister greeted all the legislators and walked into the assembly through the cordoned area. He walked straight and swift, indicating that his health is much better now.

Last five days were full of rumours and news related to the health of Parrikar who was shifted to Lilavati Hospital on February 15. He suddenly took ill and went to Mumbai. The version about his health went on changing from food poisoning to mild pancreatitis. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Vice President of India Venkaiah Naidu visited him in the hospital.

Parrikar had faced the medical emergency little before the Budget Session for which he was preparing. The Budget which is usually tabled in March was preponed. The session was in the news for the demands like installation of statues. Mining issue was hovering around with people looking at the assembly for the solution.

And then Parrikar's ill-health happened. Entire focus was shifted. The session was curtailed from 40-odd days to just four days. MGP leader Sudin Dhavalikar was made leader of the House and he was made to play a role of chief minister. It was decided that Dhavalikar would table the Budget. Till the morning of February 22, the discussions were around whether Dhavalikar will just table the Budget or will read the speech.

BJP camp was adamant that Dhavalikar should only table the budget and sit down, while Dhavalikar wanted to read it. Afterall, he would have created history if he had to read the budget. He would have been first



non-finance minister of the State to table or read the Budget.

Even when assembly began, there was not even a slight hint of what was going to happen. And suddenly, news of Parrikar's discharge started floating. BJP leaders were initially in the denial mode. They said that he would not come and his discharge was just a rumour. But as the time passed, the news was confirmed that Parrikar will fly by a chartered flight.

And he did it. Much to the surprise of the legislators and his voters, Parrikar descended at Dabolim airport and from there went to his residence at Dona Paula by a private car. Sources stated that State government had arranged for a special ambulance to bring him but he refused to travel by it and instead sat in the car and came home.

After resting for some time, he again travelled till assembly complex. He chaired a State cabinet meeting which is mandatory before placing of the budget. The cabinet approved the budget and then Parrikar walked into the assembly.

It was perhaps for the first time that chief minister was received with warm applause in the House. Everyone, including opposition benches, stood up to greet him. And in his own style, Parrikar walked with a bag containing Budget documents with him. While preparation of Budget was a prolonged exercise for Parrikar, he took only five minutes to speak about it. He was feeble in his voice. But still spoke. He told the House that he is not able to place the entire budget due to his health conditions. But would do it later, before end of the current financial year.

Parrikar just read the figures in the budget while specifying only few major aspects. The populist and development oriented measures like employment and education was highlighted by him in the budget. He did not elaborate on them. But the focus of the budget was certainly these two aspects.

The state government has been

facing the issue of unemployment which it needs to find solution. This budget has a provision for the same. Though the details are not explained through a customary speech that is delivered on the floor of the House. Parrikar said that the employment and education is interlinked.

The chief minister said that the government has laid stress on generating local employment for which total provisions of Rs. 548.89 crores in the sectors of Industry, labour and employment, Information and Technology. In the total education sector including medical education, a total of Rs. 2445 crores have been made.

The total budget is a revenue surplus. The size of budget has also increased. The gross total budgetary expenditure is Rs. 17,123 crores as against Rs. 16,027.01 crores for the year 2017-18 representing an increase of 6.84 per cent over the last year.

The total estimated expenditure on revenue account is Rs. 11795.40 crores while the expenditure on Capital Account is Rs. 4218.25 crore. There is an increase in the allocation for capital account expenditure by 10.70 per cent as compared to the revised estimate for the last year, which stands at Rs. 3808.72 crores.

Parrikar said that overall for the year 2018-19, the annual financial statement indicates a revenue surplus for the fifth year in succession. "The revenue surplus is estimated at Rs. 144.65 crores," he said. Parrikar said that during the

financial year, the public debt receipts are estimated at Rs. 1769.22 crores resulting in a fiscal deficit of Rs. 763.68 crores.

The chief minister said that as per the Economic Survey 2017-18 tabled in the assembly, the GSDP for the year 2017-18 is provisionally estimated to be Rs. 70257 crores, which reveals a growth of around 10 per cent. The



total public debt is estimated at Rs. 13937.37 crores, which represents a Public debt to GSDP ratio of 18.06 per cent.

While Budget will decide the future course of path for the State, it also reflects whether state government has managed to rule or not. That is why, this budget is also important for the alliance partners like Goa Forward Party which has been going around claiming to be protectors of Goenkarponn.

Under normal circumstances, chief minister would have announced the populist schemes attracting the cheers. But this has not happened.

There are also several questions which are left unanswered. What is in store for the people who are affected with the crisis on mining industry is



also not clear. If Parrikar was in good health, he would have spelt our the measures to rescue them from the current situation. But the figures does not reveal anything right now. There may be some relief already thought about but they are still in darkness.

Another thing that happened this time is that the opposition benches were clueless what to react for the budget. While ruling benches blindly depending on the five minutes speech by Parrikar based their reaction, the opposition legislators had to wait. The legislator like Aleixo Reginaldo would have grabbed this opportunity to criticize the government but he missed it.

The ruling legislators like Nilesh Cabral had to save themselves from reacting by stating that they were busy looking at the charismatic chief



minister who showed the willpower and they didn't get into the details of the budget.

This would certainly spare the newspapers from losing their lot of space next day. But the real budget will not be understood to the common neonle.

While we could keep the entire economic aspects of the budget aside, the take home from the entire exercise is that Manohar Parrikar has shown that he can really do it. It also is an example for us to emulate the dedication from this person who went through unexpected bad patch of life and still stood up.

Sometimes controversy. These could be some ingredients to propel something to success. But a good product will always have the longevity factor. The quality of the product will eventually stay in your mind for long and that is eventually all that matters.

The Pace-setting Leader



t is that time of the year! Over the last couple of months, we have been seeing a steady stream of award shows, and all the big ones have already been held, including the Golden Globes, but now it's time for the final one: The Academy Awards, or like we usually call them, the Oscars! Let's take a look at what's at stake this year.

Now, the nominees this year are quite inclusive, as one might think after The Academy finally started recognising talent of colored people, with even Moonlight taking home the much deserved Best Picture Award last year. However, the Academy still remains averse to comedies. To put things in perspective, let's talk about the Best Picture nominees of the year. The category has nine nominees this year: Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri, The Post, The Shape of Water, Dunkirk, Lady Bird, Get Out, Call Me By Your Name, Phantom Thread, and Darkest Hour.

Now, all the movies in this category are strong contenders. Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri is a fan favorite, showing a mother's struggle to get justice for her daughter's murder, with gripping performances by Frances McDormand, Woody Harrelson, and Sam Rockwell. The Post is about the Washington Post's struggle to stay afloat as the government declared a war on it, with Meryl Streep and Tom Hanks lighting up the screen. Dunkirk is a World War II saga by Christopher Nolan that is some of the finest and most coherent storytelling in recent times. Darkest Hour stars our favorite Sirius Black, Gary Oldman, as Winston Churchill, making it the second film in the roster to be a World War II movie.

Guillermo Del Toro's fantasy, The Shape of Water is also one of the frontrunners for the award, but by now you must have noticed the fact that the Academy has very obviously ignored the best comedy of the year: The Disaster Artist. The Academy has for long known to snub comedies, but this year's, is the biggest. James Franco's pet project, The Disaster Artist, depicts the story behind the making of what is considered as the worst movie in the recent history of Hollywood: The Room. The mysterious Tommy Wiseau put a lot of money into making The Room with his friend Greg Sestero. While the movie had a budget of \$6 million, all of which came from Wiseau, it made only \$1,800 at the box office, but has since then become a cult classic for being hilariously bad. The Disaster Artist, on the other hand, is a brilliant film showing the whole journey behind The Room.

The Academy has a limit of total 10 films to be admitted into the Best Picture category, but only none were picked this year, with The Disaster Artist being left out, despite there being plenty of room for it. Moving on to the Best Actor category, James Franco deserved a nomination even more than the movie did, but he was left out as well. I'm guessing the Academy's aversion to comedy roles and its whiteknighting with regards to the recent unproven sexual harassment allegations against Franco led to him missing out on the nomination. Not only was he left out of this category, but the Best Direction nomination evaded him as well.

The only ray of hope for the inclusion of comedy as a serious filmmaking genre is the nomination in the best adapted screenplay category. The Disaster Artist is based on the book of the same name, written by Greg Sestero, and Scott Neustadter & Michael H. Weber managed to bag a nomination for adapting it to the big screen.

As far as the actual wins for the year go, Best Picture is a tough battle, in addition to most other leading categories. The only clear wins include Best Actor, which is likely to be a win for Gary Oldman, and Best Supporting Actor, with Sam Rockwell set as the winner.

While the quality of pictures at the Oscars never really wavers, I wish it would include comedies. Let's face it, it would be pretty great to see a great comedic project being appreciated for all the effort it made to make us all life. I'm not rooting for the likes of Scary Movie here, just hoping for a little bit of inclusion, as the trend is these days.




The king shouted at his servants, "Hey, there is something in my bed that has bitten me. Look for it, as I have already been bitten."

However, life is a difficult maze; hence staying motivated all the time does not seem possible. especially at a work place.

This makes the employee feel respected and recognized for the extra effort they have put in further making them more efficient and productive.
- Authority and Trust: Management needs to let go some of their authority in the hands of the efficient employees. This has is its own set of advantages. Firstly, management can overlook on some issues

where an employee can also take a decision and give attention to other vital work. Secondly, the employee will feel more important as he is been given the authority to take decisions for the company. If this method is adopted by the management, it will reflect as though the company and the management trust in this employee.



Management needs to learn to create a bond with its employees rather than just walking straight responding to the half-hearted "Good Morning" wishes. Management needs to learn to give time to its employees. Let them pop into your cabin and discuss any problem they are facing at work or with the work atmosphere or anything else that's bugging them.
- 8) Do not Pressurize: Most of the employees consider work life like a hamster wheel, hence, it would really count if the management avoids pressurizing its employees. There are times when an employee has his own set of work plus sudden management requested reports that they need to complete. In this, it would really keep the employee motivated to do the work if they are not pressurized on the extra work.
- 9) Let them have their space: Management should not keep interrupting an employee's personal space. Let them take a break. Let them receive calls (only a genuine employee would not take calls when the work is overflowing). Let them talk, laugh and have fun with their teammates. This is also essential for good team building achieving set targets. At the end, work done well is what counts.
- 10) Be a mentor: Management should learn how to inspire the employee who is not performing well at work. Guide them, explain things properly and encourage them if they are losing hope.
